Would recommend that the visit there also includes a trip to the Haworth Wool Scouring Mill in Bradford!

## Final conference for the project

To fulfill the project deliverables, there needs to be held a final conference in Poland. As the project received the okay for being prolonged until April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2024, the conference was postponed until this coming fall. The plan was that the cultural activities and traditions in connection with transhumance would be part of the conference, however, considering the late date of the conference this is not possible. The proposed dates have been decided: the conference will start on the evening of October 25<sup>th</sup>. The main conference proceedings will be 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, with technical tours on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

#### Other Wool related activities and conferences

It looks like the Baltic Wool Conference will not take place in 2023. But this does not mean that wool will be "off the table"! As you have already surmised, there will be a presence for WOOLUME in several conferences. There are also other opportunities, for example the Natural Fiber Conference will be held in Biella, Italy, 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> of September, 2023. They have just started planning the program, and Tone has been invited to speak, but of course we can suggest other speakers! There will be a wool conference held by the National Museum in Oslo on the 21<sup>st</sup> of September, in connection with the wool exhibit which is opening there on May 25<sup>th</sup>. Ingun and Tone have contributed to the exhibit's catalogue with a chapter, expanding on some of the themes from Local, Slow and Sustainable Fashion: Wool as a Fabric for Change.

## Tøffen – a tv-star!

Ingun participated in a popular tv-program, *Praktisk info med Jon Almaas*, which aims to give practical advice to viewers about more or less everything. For a good 15 minutes, the viewers could learn all sorts of things about wool, as the program had visited the wool station at Gol, Ingun was asked all sorts of questions about wool's properties and Tøffen, an old Norwegian Spæl sheep, charmed everyone.





#### **Future applications**

There has been now interest to follow up the EU Horizon call for "food, bioeconomy, natural resources and the environment" so far from any of the ongoing projects or networks. No one has really had time either to follow up the new Soil Mission from the EU. Tone will be travelling to Riga after Easter and will have meetings with the Nordic Council of Ministers, for possible bilateral funding under Interreg for the Baltic Sea region. This will, however, not be related to wool, but looking at how to develop Targeted Producer Responsibility and thereby influencing PEF, and the ecodesign directive, both which currently are not very positive for wool.
